BRANCH LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT

"Training for Trainers", a pilot program developed by the AAUW Member Leadership Programs staff, is provided in order to expand access to leadership training for members and branch leaders.

Training programs will be released as they are developed. The first one that will be available is "Designing Effective Meetings". The training programs, including a PowerPoint and materials, can only be accessed by those who have completed the Training for Trainers and have signed on to be a trainer.

There will be support for trainers, including a networking platform for trainers and possibly a LinkedIn group as well.

The intent, at least at the initial stages, is that trainers provide programs for their branch or for nearby branches. Money is not available from AAUW to pay for travel or other expenses.

The target groups are AAUW members, but the training could be used with other groups for professional development or could be offered to student AAUW groups. This is another way to achieve visibility for AAUW in communities or on campuses.

The "Training for Trainers" webinar has been presented several times and will be repeated on January 12, 2015 from 6-7 PM Central Time.
