It is a forum for timely commentary and discussion on current news and events that relate to AAUW's mission. The 11th briefing (Oct 13) focused on Joint Board meetings of the Association and the Educational Foundation. It includes a listing of board actions taken in preparation for the vote of the members on the proposed organizational restructure, at which point the unified organization would be known as AAUW.

The 10th briefing (Sept 26) presents a new online feature, the AAUW Member Showcase. It enables branch, state, and national events to be publicized nationwide on the AAUW website, illustrating the breadth of our community and the diversity of our programs to help break through barriers for women and girls.

The 9th briefing (Sept 15) tells how AAUW is developing new, VOLUNTARY, electronic options to provide convenience, efficiency, cost savings, and simplification for our dues payment and processing. The purpose of these options is to offer those who want an easier way to (a) manage branch, state, and national dues payment, collection, and processing and (b) track current membership status throughout the year. **Participation is optional. Any member or branch may choose to participate** — **or not.** MPP options will be available online beginning May 1, 2009, for the 2010 fiscal year.
