#### **ASSOCIATION LINKS**

AAUW has joined with CARE as a partner in its international work.

In addition, in partnership with coalition partner, the National Committee to Preserve Social Security and Medicare will make available to members of branches interested, training for caucus goers. Contact Janet Witt at email address <u>wittj@MCPSSM.org</u>. She is the Grassroots manager for this project. The workshop is two hours long, explains the caucus process and focuses on platform planks related to Medicare, Social Security and Home and community Services. It does not endorse or discuss candidates. Witt writes that specific sites have not been selected but the following communities have been decided on for training, Sioux City, Davenport, Council Bluffs, Fort Dodge, Ames, Des Moines, Ottumwa, Waterloo, and Cedar Rapids.
