## **AAUW Iowa Leadership Opportunities**

Leadership is a key component for dynamic growth in AAUW. This is necessary at branch, state and national levels as AAUW endeavors to be the organization empowering women and girls. Education, economic success, health, social, and political issues are at the forefront of our objectives. Because AAUW members care, we must continue to lead.

Because AAUW lowa is a volunteer-based organization, with no paid staff, we rely on our members to accomplish the work of the organization. Serving at the state level is highly rewarding. Working with energetic, purposeful women on the state board brings forth the best in each of us. The board is a supportive group of women who work as a team and you are needed on that team. While some positions for 2016-2018 will be filled by members continuing for a second term, there are positions awaiting nominees.

#### Who Do We Need?

The Nominations Committee is making an active search for *elected officers* for the 2016-2018 term: program co-vice president, membership vice president, secretary, and treasurer. We thank the members who have served in these offices in which they gave their time and talents so generously.

There are opportunities to serve as *appointed members* of the Board of Directors as well, such as web manager, administrative assistant, gender equity director, and diversity director. We are also in need of at least one additional person to be a web technician (facilitate Blackboard Collaborate meetings).

#### AAUW Iowa Board—The Basics

Members of the AAUW Iowa Board of Directors establish priorities for the organization through strategic planning and budgeting. Board members are expected to attend the yearly State Conference and all board meetings. There are three or four meetings per year, two of which are online via Blackboard Collaborate (an online meeting platform). Expenses for mileage and one half the double occupancy hotel rate are reimbursed for meetings. Board members write reports for board meetings, write an annual report, and contribute articles to the Connector or the Iowa Initiative newsletter.

There is a job description for each board member in the AAUW Iowa Policies. The time commitment to serve on the board varies with the particular board position. Those leaving the board are expected to provide transition materials and assistance to those assuming the board position.

AAUW Iowa business and communication is primarily done through email or Blackboard Collaborate, so it's important that board members have basic computer and email skills, and that they regularly check email. It's very helpful to have access to Microsoft Word and Excel.
