Shape the Future this Spring!

Shape the Future events provide branches opportunities to recruit new members at half the national AAUW rate of \$62. Memberships created now get 15 months, since membership runs until June 30, 2022. But Shape the Future events can be held any time from March through the fall. Another great reason to get new members with this program is the free memberships your branch will receive: one free membership for every two Shape the Future applications!!!

On the national AAUW website you can download a brochure to print and hand out for people who prefer to write a check. (Go to https://www.aauw.org/resources/ member/governance-tools/state-branch/shape-the-future -campaign/) For those who prefer digital access, registration is super simple. Your branch treasurer or other officer with access to the Member Services Database (https://www.aauw.org/resources/member/ governance-tools/state-branch/) simply chooses the Shape the Future option from the menu on the left side of the page. See Figure 1 below. Simply fill in a date for the last day to register after your event. They suggest 10

days. Then ask for the link. Now you get the link, ready to copy and paste. See Figure 2 on p. 6. Simply share this link with any prospective member who attended your event, and they can register online with a credit card. They will need to supply their contact information, college or university, degree earned, and date of graduation.

You can register more than one Shape the Future event using this same process. Simply enter a new end date, and you'll receive a new link. I believe you should do this for each event, since national is keeping a record of the events. I tested this with my daughter's information. Her membership was immediately registered, and an automatic email was sent to me as branch treasurer, and also to our branch membership chairs. Easy peasy!

So let's have some fun this spring! Your events can be virtual, and you can interact with your prospects via email. Not as personal, but still doable during these pandemic times! Invite participants to join on the spot to receive 50% off national dues. Remember, AAUW national dues are \$62, of which \$59 are tax deductible.

Vote in the AAUW Election

There is an AAUW election this spring, and all AAUW members are eligible to vote. This election includes a bylaws change to remove the degree requirement, and a vote on 2021-23 Public Policy Priorities. Voting will open April 7, 2021, and close May 17, 2021. You are encouraged to vote online, but you may request a paper ballot before April 16. You may find information about their rationale in the Open Membership Toolkit. From the Board of Directors:

"The AAUW National Board of Directors strongly supports elimination of the degree requirement for membership and will put the requirement up for a membership vote this spring. This important change is a critical step in bringing AAUW's bylaws and membership requirement in line with our mission of advancing equity for women and girls. While AAUW is fiercely committed to the educational attainment of all women, given our commitment to inclusion, this is simply the right thing to do."
